1. IUGG 2005 Annual Report

Thanks to the individual reports from the IUGG Associations and Union Commissions, a summary document of 2005 IUGG activities is complete and ready to post on the website. A printed copy of the report will be sent to all Adhering Bodies within the month. Highlights include the IUGG response to the December, 2004, South East Asia Tsunami, reports of 6 Association Scientific Assemblies, the meetings of the IUGG Finance Committee, the Bureau, the Executive Committee, and a meeting of the 2007 IUGG General Assembly Scientific Programme Committee. 2. Union Commission Symposium on Studies of Earth's Deep Interior

Studies of Earth's Deep Interior (SEDI), an IUGG Union Commission, will hold their 10th Symposium on 9-14 July 2006, in Prague, Czech Republic. The scientific focus of SEDI is an enhanced understanding of the past evolution and current thermal, dynamical and chemical state of the Earth's deep interior and the effect that the interior has on the structures and processes observed at the surface of the Earth. 3. Report of the Electronic Geophysical Year (eGY) Planning Meeting

The annual planning meeting of the Electronic Geophysical Year initiative (eGY), held in Boulder, Colorado, March 13-14, succeeded in setting out clear directions and a program for the future. The program is diversifying as eGY activities and national committees are becoming established in a rapidly growing number of countries - Australia, Canada, China, India, Japan, Russia, UK, and the USA.

eGY will be launched officially on 1 July 2007 in Perugia, Italy, and will run until December 2008. Publications and practical demonstrations of modern capability and best practice are to be the major thrust during 2006 for conveying the eGY principles set out in the "Declaration for a Geoscience Information Commons" (see www.egy.org). We agreed on a series of meetings, workshops, publications, and a program of developing demonstration projects. One of the most important of these is a general-use case demonstration - a 'proof of concept' showcase of the power of virtual observatories and modern information systems to meet present and future information needs of people who are non-specialist scientists (decision-makers, public, and so on) or scientists who come from other specialist backgrounds.

4. ICSU March 2006 Newsletter is posted

The March 2006 ICSU Newsletter has been posted on the website: www.ICSU.org. Items of specific interest to IUGG include the following.

- A dedicated International Polar Year (IPY) Data Policy and Management Subcommittee has been established.
- A new Planning Group on Natural and Human-Induced Environmental Hazards will be chaired by Professor Gordon McBean. The members of the group are yet to be announced.
- ICSU is considering co-sponsoring THORPEX, a WMO weather research programme.
- The GEO Committee on Science and Technology will meet at UNESCO 19-20 April to discuss the implementation of the 2006 Workplan and decide on the process by which the scientific and technological community can provide input to the 2007-2008 Workplan. ICSU has distributed the list of tasks assigned to the Committee and has invited interest in getting involved with task implementation.
- The ICSU Regional Office for Africa has established scoping groups to consider 4 priority issues: global change; natural and human-induced hazards; human health; and sustainable energy.
- The ICSU Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific will be located at the Academy of Sciences, Malaysia. The inauguration will take place on 18-19 September in conjunction with a regional symposium on "Natural and Human-induced Hazards and Disasters."
- The ICSU Regional Office for Latin America and the Caribbean is under consideration for Rio de Janeiro.
- The Priority Area Assessment on Capacity Building is available on the ICSU website.
- ICSU will establish an ad hoc scoping group on Human Health, and a Review Panel on the ICSU Grants Programme.
- The 75th Anniversary of ICSU will take place on 11 July 2006, and several special events will recognize the occasion.

5. "Padma Shri" Award for Harsh Gupta

Dr. Harsh Gupta, IUGG Bureau Member, was given the prestigious 'Padma Shri' Award by Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, President of Republic of India on March 20, 2006. Padma Awards are the highest civilian awards in India and were instituted some 40 years ago. These are given for outstanding performance in any field. Dr. Gupta is the third Geo-Scientist to get this award.
